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3. Pandemic Flu

The Pandemic Flu agenda item is in response to a request from briefing from the SRP at the last meeting.

SRP Paper 2 provides key background and information relating to the discussion questions.

Please introduce Dr Gregor Smith (Deputy Chief Medical Officer) and NR (Head of Resilience Response and Communications Unit, Scottish Government) to provide the briefing and then facilitate discussion.

Discussion questions:

- Do our organisations understand the potential impact of a serious flu pandemic?
- Pandemic flu is the highest rated risk in the National Risk Assessment. Do we believe that this is reflected in the priority it is afforded, in both local and national planning?
- Are we clear on how our own organisation should and/or does work with partner organisations in planning for and responding to a serious flu pandemic – particularly in relation to local and regional resilience partnerships and the new Health & Social Care Partnerships – as well as the inter-dependencies of Business Continuity plans?
- Given the role of the SRP to set strategic direction and priorities for resilience in Scotland as well as to provide collective assurance to Ministers, what can we do to support pandemic planning?


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Resilience Vision for Scotland

At the first meeting of the SRP there was strong support to develop a collective long-term understanding of resilience – with agreement from SRP members to share any futures thinking of long term scenario planning work they have undertaken and who their contact/expert is.

Scottish Government officials have started some work on collating this 'futures' thinking – as well as developing some work on defining what a Resilience Vision could cover. Current thinking is that initially a Resilience Vision should be a 'Civil Contingencies Resilience' vision placed in the wider context of (and/or contributing to) societal, economic and environmental resilience (such as the work done around National Outcome 11 - We have strong, resilient and supportive communities where people take responsibility for their own actions and how they affect others and the recently published (July 2017) Justice in Scotland: Vision and Priorities).

We are hoping that a paper outlining current thinking about what a Resilience Vision could cover is circulated within the next few months for SRP members comments and then for further discussion at our next meeting. DFM is very keen on the development of a Resilience Vision.



Assessment of Risk and Preparedness – based on RRP RPAs (Risk and Preparedness Assessments), Essential Services Impact Assessments and Scottish Government Policy Leads Assessments

At the first meeting of the SRP (September 2016) we received a briefing about a number of key projects that contribute to improving the way we assess risk, protect critical infrastructure and assess preparedness in Scotland. These key projects were:

- The UK National Risk Assessment
- · The Scottish Risk Assessment
- · The RRPs Risk and Preparedness Assessments
- Improving Critical Infrastructure Resilience (CIR) in Scotland
- CONTEST Protect

It is proposed that – in line with the SRP purpose of adding value to resilience national processes and continuous improvement projects – we get an update of risk and preparedness at our next meeting.

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Recommendations from the strategic review of multi-agency resilience learning and exercising

We have been asked as the SRP to consider the recommendations of a strategic review of multi-agency learning and exercising activities that the Scottish Government is commissioning.

That review will commence next month (November) and is looking at opportunities for enhancement. In particular being able to offer assurance that we have a strategic picture of the multi-agency learning and exercising need (both at local and national levels) and are building greater collaboration and interoperability when planning, delivering and evaluating learning and exercising activity.

The review will involve discussion and consultation with a range of resilience partners although there will be a focus on Category 1 responders.

As the review will focus on multi-agency learning and exercising activities at a strategic level, I believe it is appropriate that the SRP considers the review recommendations.

The Terms of Reference indicates that while recommendations can be aspirational, they should wherever possible be able to be implemented utilising current resources.
