- 21. Summing up, the First Minister indicated she would be setting out an outline of the measures to be introduced at an emergency briefing to be broadcast nationally later that afternoon, following preliminary discussion with the leaders of the other political parties represented in the Parliament. She expected to provide a further update to the Parliament on Tuesday, 22 December, but no new levels review would be required that day.
- 22. Although the measures proposed might appear disproportionate to some in view of the relatively low level of cases in most parts of Scotland, public health principles required that Ministers act ahead of time, and it was likely that the majority of the public would understand this message at a very difficult time for the nation.
- 23. Subject to final consideration, and taking into account the points made by Cabinet members, it was likely that the measures the First Minister would announce later that afternoon would include a move to Level 4 for all mainland areas, with a lower level of restrictions for island areas only. However, access to the islands would be likely to be limited to those with an address on the island, as during the early 'lockdown' stages of the pandemic. New regulations and revised guidance would need to be put in place rapidly to effect these changes.

24. Cabinet:

- (a) Agreed to delegate to the First Minister the responsibility for finalising proposals in response to the threat posed by the new variant of the virus and all decisions that might be required in advance of her planned public statement later that afternoon;
- (b) Delegated to the First Minister and Mr Swinney the responsibility for any further decisions that might be required to take into account any material changes in circumstances of which they might become aware;
- (c) Agreed that all necessary actions should be put in hand to ensure that the necessary changes to regulations, guidance and advice would be in place so that the changes in the content and application of the *Strategic Framework* described above could be announced by the First Minister at her media briefing that afternoon, and publicised, implemented, and enforced from Saturday, 26 December onwards, or as and when required.
