# Coronavirus in Scotland: Clinical director Jason Leitch sorry for his herd immunity claim

Scotland's national clinical director has apologised for his claim that the Scottish government was following a "herd immunity" strategy in the early stages of the coronavirus outbreak.

Jason Leitch said he was "unusually sorry" for telling the BBC that the Scottish government wanted to gradually increase the number of people infected with coronavirus on March 10.

Professor Leitch doubled down in a Channel 4 interview six

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the plan to tackle Covid-19.

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Nicola Sturgeon, the first minister, and Boris Johnson, the prime minister, later denied pursuing herd immunity after scientists warned it could see up to 80 per cent of the population infected and lead to 250,000 deaths.

Ms Sturgeon is under fresh scrutiny over decisions taken in early March as more details emerge about Scotland's <u>earliest known outbreak at a Nike conference in Edinburgh</u> in February that was not disclosed to the public.

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Public Health Scotland conducted just 1,393 tests in the eight days from March 2, when a Dutch delegate at the Nike conference tested positive.

Just 26 new cases were detected, including eight linked to the conference, but on March II PHS found the first case that could

not be linked to international travel, the conference or any

other known carrier

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uttering the phrase "herd immunity".

He said: "Any suggestion that any adviser wants people to die during this pandemic and that will make the world a safer place ... is completely false and upsetting.

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"The suggestion that immunity will be helpful for the virus and a pandemic remains true, we just don't know what that immunity means yet. Five months in, we don't know if we get long-term immunity, we don't know if that immunity means you can't reinfected, but it looks as though from the global evidence you probably can't.

"If you watch the whole Channel 4 interview, I was asked, 'Do you agree with Sir Patrick Vallance?' and I said 'yes' because Patrick Vallance is the chief scientific adviser of the UK and we've tried as much as possible to have consensual clinical advice.

"So I am unusually sorry that that word has become something bigger than it was ever intended to be in those early interviews two and half months ago, and thing have moved on considerably, including the science."

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
