

## NOTICE OF DETERMINATION CHANGE IN RECOGNISED LEGAL REPRESENTATIVE MODULES 2, 3, 4 AND 6 - UK HEALTH SECURITY AGENCY (UKHSA)

- On 13 October 2022, I designated the UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA) as a Core Participant in Module 2. At the same time, I designated Katrina McCrory of Mills & Reeve LLP as its qualified lawyer in relation to Module 2.
- 2. On 16 February 2023, I designated the UKHSA as a Core Participant in Module 3. At the same time, I designated Katrina McCrory of Mills & Reeve LLP as its qualified lawyer in relation to Module 3.
- 3. On 9 June 2023, the Inquiry was informed that the Government Legal Department's Covid-19 Inquiry team would be assisting UKHSA alongside Mills & Reeve LLP, and that Olivia Barnes would be acting as UKHSA's recognised legal representative in relation to Modules 2 and 3. On 13 June 2023 I designated Olivia Barnes of the Government Legal Department as its qualified lawyer in relation to Modules 2 and 3.
- 4. On 17 July 2023 and 27 February 2024, I designated UKHSA as a Core Participant in Modules 4 and 6 respectively and designated Olivia Barnes as its qualified lawyer.
- 5. On 18 March 2024, the Inquiry was informed that James McArthur would be replacing Olivia Barnes UKHSA's legal representative in relation to Modules 2, 3, 4 and 6.
- 6. Accordingly, as I am satisfied that the UKHSA has appointed Mr James McArthur as its qualified lawyer, I designate Mr James McArthur as its recognised legal representative in Modules 2, 3, 4 and 6 in accordance with Rule 6(1) of the Inquiry Rules 2006.
