



COVID-19 TRANSMISSION VALUE (ONE MONTH LOOKBACK) (Source: DoH Covid Modelling Group 17th Nov 20)






COVID-19 TRANSMISSION VALUE (Source: DoH Covid Modelling Group 17th Nov)



- The coronavirus track and trace team, which started work in March, has been expanded from 30 to almost 250 people.(BBC News)
- Health officials have said they are looking for a new site for the Covid-19 testing centre at Belfast's SSE Arena. The government said it
 was important to have long-term arrangements that ensure value for taxpayers' money (Belfast Live)
- The executive will do all it can to "protect" as much of the Christmas period as possible, However, Prof Ian Young said mid-December could be the "big risk period" (BBC News).



SELF EMPLOYMENT INCOME SUPPORT SCHEME
















Supporting Information: Weekly passengers Metro and Ulsterbus 2019 / 2020 comparison (Source: Dfl SitRep 16 Nov 2020)
