

Thanks for this – I submitted a paper to CMO for his consideration on exit strategy at the weekend. Contact tracing and testing is likely to be a key component of strategy once the epidemic is sufficiently suppressed. Looking at approaches in other countries, I estimate that 300 – 600 manual contact tracers may be required in NI. Do you know if any thought has been given at Silver level to this aspect of a testing strategy?
