Medical Officer (CMO) and Health officials.

Background

- 1. The Secretary of State for Health, Matt Hancock chaired a COBR meeting on Wednesday 29 January at 4.30pm to discuss coronavirus and consider UK preparedness. Devolved Administrations were invited to participate and the Minister for Health, Minister Swann was in attendance the meeting.
- 2. The World Health Organisation (WHO) is scheduled to meet today and is likely to increase the level of risk and advise that this may and could become a pandemic. The term pandemic reflects a situation where there is global spread. It is not a reflection of severity of illness if WHO increase the global risk level to high the collective advice of the four UK CMOs to COBR is to raise the level of risk in the UK to 'Moderate'. In practical terms this makes little or no difference to the risk to individuals in the UK butteflects the need for governments to to increase the level of planning and preparedness.

Detail

3. The Department for Health in Northern Ireland, as the lead government department are closely monitoring the rapidly evolving situation. The Secretary of State for Health, Matt Hancock chaired the COBRA meeting.

A key point to note is that FCO are currently actively involved in detailed negotiations with authorities in China regarding policy matters and logistics. A number of issues are still under negotiations, and remain unresolved, for example; flight departure details and clarification on what passengers would or would not be permitted to travel. The Foreign Secretary has spoken to the Chinese FM to press for China to allow dual nationals and dependents to depart via the evacuation flight, should the wish to do so.

Current situation update

- 4. The Chief Medical Officer for England, following consultation with the Chief Medical Officers is across the four nations, provided an overview of the clinical situation highlighting the following:
 - Explanation of the nature of Coronavirus and current modelling on how it is spreading throughout China and globally.
 - The clinical effects of the virus which range from asymptomatic to a relatively mild illness through to pneumonia.
 - > At risk groups which are currently thought to be older people and those with an underlying illness.
 - > The likelihood that a positive case will be detected at some point in the UK.
 - The need for the NHS to look at existing plans as a model for preparedness which includes well developed plans for Pandemic Influenza.

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
