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#### **ADVICE**

- Under the direction of the Chief Scientific Adviser for Health, officials have worked with a range of stakeholders and experts to produce a strategic approach to testing – National COVID-19 Test Plan – to tackle the COVID-19 epidemic within Wales.
- 2. We previously advised you on the National Testing Plan under MA/VG/1136/20 and you have requested a public facing document that sets out our approach to testing in Wales and our objectives.
- 3. The National COVID-19 Pubic Testing Plan (at Doc 1) aims to update the public on our Plan and sets out: how we will approach testing for COVID-19 in Wales; what we wish to achieve through testing; and, the steps we are taking to increasing testing capacity.
- 4. Our focus continues to be on reducing direct and indirect harm from COVID-19, with a clear emphasis on protecting the public, optimising outcomes for patients and keeping essential services running in Wales.
- 5. Given the increasing public and media attention around testing for COVID-19, we are seeking to launch the Public Plan on 7 April 2020 alongside an accompanying Written Statement (at Doc 2) which sets out how we will tackle COVID-19 in Wales, including action already underway. This includes the ongoing testing of patients and NHS frontline staff.
- 6. The public facing plan is supported by a more detailed and technical delivery plan which will be delivered over three phases (MA/VG/1136/20 refers).
- 7. We are continuing to work with our stakeholders and our networks including Public Health Wales to deliver on the plan in the timeframes identified.

## **Financial Implications**

- 8. As previously advised (M-VG-1136-20), estimating the full financial impact in the 20-21 financial year is challenging at this present time and will be subject to change from many variables including the continuing development and management of the pandemic.
- 9. MA-VG-1136-20 estimated a minimum requirement of up to £22.5m of funding will be required initially. Work is ongoing to revise this estimate as procurement takes place and testing volume is increased. There is no further reference to the amount of funding being committed in the public facing document and the Ministerial statement. HSS Officials are liaising with colleagues in SB to keep them up to date on cost estimates. The costs of the Testing Strategy cannot be met from the HSS MEG and there will need to be a call on the central COVID-19 response fund to meet this financial requirement.

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### Communication and media handling

10. There is significant media and public interest in testing for COVID-19. A written statement has been prepared for your agreement (at Doc 2) to be issued alongside publication of the Public Plan.

- 11. Supporting communication lines have been prepared along with a technical briefing with media on 7 April 2020, and supporting social media content including a video of Rob Orford.
- 12. You will be provided with briefing notes prior to the press conference, which will include lines on the Public Plan and testing capacity.
