Dear Prime Minister,

I am writing to express my frustration and concern about the process of assigning the traffic light system for international travel. The process over the summer has been haphazard with late papers and last minute changes. This reached a new low point yesterday when Covid-O met to decide the traffic light risk allocations and the other governments within the UK were not invited. This is obviously very disappointing, particularly given your commitments following the Heads of Government summit in June regarding more effective intergovernmental collaboration across the UK.

Here, I provide just one example of the points we would have raised had we been part of the discussions. Spain has reported cases of B.1.621, recording the highest number in Europe. I understand that arrivals from Spain, and all its islands will be advised to use a PCR test as their pre-departure test wherever possible. Had we been at the meeting, we would undoubtedly have argued for processes to be in place to ensure those travelling into the UK from Spain are subject to consistent and robust PCR surveillance - including PCR pre-departure tests, as one mitigation against importing vaccine escape variants.

I am copying this letter to my counterparts in the Scottish Government and the Northern Ireland Executive as well as to the Chancellor of the Duchy of Lancaster, the Secretary of State for Wales and the Head of UK Governance Group.
