Hi Albert,

DM spoke with VG and FM today about testing etc. They were not convinced that there is scientific merit (nor capacity) to test sector-wide. I agree with them, we cant test 20,000 residents and similar numbers of staff routinely. However, DM argued we need some better approach than testing by symptom, and FM is asking that CMO, Andrew and yourself examine the case for doing more than testing by symptom only (such as selective testing in hot spots – my example) and report back to FM, VG and JM. What would be the aims and evidence for this. I said there were views from the field that testing would assist in care triage and planning and in preventing asymptomatic staff from infecting etc. However, I don't have sources (providers/ADSS/CFW) that can substantiate the importance of testing more widely and hope you may be able to generate such for your involvement with CMO/Andrew? I think we can't argue for universal testing (at this point) but must argue that (a) we will have a year of covid to cope with in homes I suspect (b) we must prioritise spare testing capacity in high risk settings where covid has flared and needs control (c) consider how through testing we might find ways to isolate covid infected residents more successfully in settings or in transfers to other treatment settings other than hospital (d) rotate the testing of staff in infected settings to reduce risk. Well that's my starter for 4, I will do some research myself. Perhaps we can discuss in next day or so. Best, NR
