- Only 350 pupils showed up yesterday, with many more teachers available, over 2 per pupil. 200 sites with no pupils.
- These will be rationalised from today, to take into account the other teachers now self-isolating.
- Would be interested in seeing figures on how these efforts are impacting on the resilience of key workers.

DfE

Working with some NI companies that are putting together testing kits for RoW

 to see if these can be redirected to internal use. Must be certified that the tests are fit for purpose.

Action DfE: DfE to liaise with DoH on the local producers of testing kits.

Dfl

No issues requiring escalation to CCG.

DoF

- Will be liaising with DfE on the implementation of the small business grants scheme to ensure smooth workings of the scheme.
- Will be issuing guidance on payment of money to government suppliers to help ensure this keeps flowing during the current period.

DoJ

- Peter May said that Prison Staffing numbers are beginning to drop and will be monitored closely. He said testing will help once available.
- Peter also raised concerns about the preparations around a temporary mortuary, especially if construction companies may be ceasing activities.

DfC

- Tracey Meharg said that they have seen a very large increase in workload, with 10,000 claims coming in last week.
- They are redeploying staff across the department but have run into significant issues around the shortages of appropriate IT kit. May be worth considering redeployment of kit from other departments.

Action DoF: DoF to liaise with DfC on the supply of appropriate IT kit

NI Hub

 Anthony Harbison said that the NI Hub will be issuing a simplified Sitrep from today to ease the burden on departments and to ensure that only the most necessary information is required.
