KEY POINTS DISCUSSED:

- Details set out in the MACA request submitted on Thursday 14 January
- DOH/MOD NI has everything in place and ready to go
- Minister Swann advised that FMdFM were content that the request for MACA should be led by DOH. Formal notification to FMdFM was provided on 14.1.2021 with no objections raised to date.
- Role of the Combat Medical Technicians (CMTs) on deployment to NI hospitals.
- Minister Heappey deployment of CMTs will be subject to frequent review as there may be a requirement to redeploy them to the National Vaccine Programme or elsewhere across the UK.
- Communications and media handling

ISSUES AGREED:

- Minister Heappey confirmed his approval, and that of the Secretary of State for Defence, to the MACA request and that 110 CMT will be deployed to NI to assist with the COVID pandemic.
- CMTs will only be used in NI's hospitals Antrim Area Hospital, Ulster Hospital Dundonald and the Belfast City Hospital Nightingale facility.
- Deployment of CMTs will be kept under frequent review.
- Any communication/media will be led by MOD NI and DOH at a local level.
