Steffan Jones re Dashboard:

2% infection- big increase- rate of increase may be slowing but this had been the prompt for the interventions a week ago.

Mixed picture on three dimensions:

- 1. Regional - London slow and maybe declining; NW now rising - heading for 3% cf London
- 2. Age - Increase for all cohorts; School age beginning to fall, but rise in older groups
- New Variant Rising everywhere; In London and SE total growth v heavily driven by new 3. variant; but elsewhere (eg NW and NE England) some of the Christmas growth was from the old variant

Case rate per 100k – some very high figures eg 1,600 Barking

NW showing rapid growth

Hospitals - 3718 admissions on latest available - average 3000 a day

Numbers in hospitals- 32,000 cf first wave peak of c 20,000

Ventilation - 20% of ventilated beds were Covid patients in mid-December now 50%

Deaths 700-800 on some days

Cases were being made by a number of groups for degrees of priority for vaccination – there would be clinical and political choices

Madeleine Allesandri asked about a request from NI HSC to GB for help re staffing capacity ie medical personnel deployment

Clara Swinson referred to a named list and said she would come back offline re mutual aid. [DN NIO seems to be have been helpful in this context]
