Main Developments

- One death related to Covid-19 has been reported, bringing the total number of deaths to 539.
- Figures published by NISRA show that Covid-19 related deaths have fallen for the sixth consecutive week. 19 deaths involving Covid-19 occurred in the week from 30th May to 5th June, bringing the total of Covid-19 related deaths to 779.
- Of these, 395 (50.7%) occurred in a hospital, 334 (42.9%) in care homes, eight (1.1%) in a hospice and 42 (5.4%) at residential addresses or other locations.
- The 342 deaths in care homes and hospices involved 78 separate establishments.
- NI has lowest UK nations Covid-19 death rate with new figures from NISRA reporting 779 deaths here by 5 June (185.9 per 100,000 population). England had the highest rate with 363.8, Scotland with 319.5 and wales with 289.3 per 100,000 population.
- NI is the first nation in the UK to allow the reopening of all retail shops from today, footfall is being reported as still considerably down on pre-pandemic levels.
- DfC and DoH have partnered with charities to launch a new virtual wellbeing hub to promote positive mental health during
 Covid-19.
- ONS reports that UK GDP fell by 20.4% in April due to the effects of lockdown.
- Traffic flows for Thursday 11th June were were up 6.3% from Wednesday's flows and up 11.8% on the previous Thursday.
 While levels are 29% down on normal Thursday flows compared to similar periods in 2018 & 2019; they are the largest traffic volumes since lockdown commenced.
- NIHUB scaled down to minimum operational level. Final SITREP issued today.






Cumulative Total of Laboratory Completed Tests by Date of Laboratory Test




Cumulative Individuals with Laboratory Completed Test for SARS-COV2 Virus by Date of Specimen

Nearly all of France is now in a so-called "green zone", where restrictions can be eased faster, where bars and restaurants can reopen. Gatherings of fewer than 10 people are also permitted.



Bars and restaurants are open, but hosting reduced numbers of diners. Church services have resumed, but with strict social distancing. funerals are allowed with a maximum of 15 people. Schools will not reopen until 1 Sept.



All federal states offer a minimum of presence lessons for all pupils. Social distancing measures have been extended until 29 June. Relaxation of measures at neighbouring borders. All shops are open subject to social distancing rules.



Poland and Sweden are the only EU countries to have not yet passed their COVID-19 peak, according to European Centre for Disease Prevention and Control (ECDC).

UNITED KINGDOM

- The number of people testing positive for Coronavirus in England is continuing to fall according to estimates from ONS, based on 20,000 tests.
- The UK government has dropped plans for full EU border checks on imports from 1 January 2021 after EU exit, over fears of the economic impact of Coronavirus.
- The UK's economy shrank by a record 20.4% in April, the largest monthly contraction on record, as the country spent its first full month in lockdown.
- Health Secretary, Matt Hancock has said up to 80% of people who tested positive for Coronavirus in the UK don't have symptoms, based on ONS sample.
- The most deprived parts of England and Wales have been hit twice as hard by Covid, the ONS has said. They also say urban areas were markedly worse than rural.
- An unpublished govt. report said that black, Asian and minority ethnic (BAME) groups in Britain should be given targeted health advice in the event of a 2nd wave.
- Media reporting on divided opinions on the 2m distance rule with MPs saying it will have a devastating effect on hospitality and some medics saying it will save lives.
- Relatives of 450 people who have died in the pandemic are demanding an immediate public inquiry, following the NAO report on the readiness of NHS in England.
- Airbus has warned that its UK employees face more job cuts than counterparts in France and Germany, as they are maintaining wage subsidies for up to two years.
- BA, Easyjet and Ryanair have launched legal action against the government's quarantine measures, they are asking for a JR to be heard as soon as possible.

REPUBLIC OF IRELAND

- Dr Motherway has told HSE that the temporary redeployment of staff to Covid-19 work was not sustainable and ICU needs to be doubled on a permanent basis.
- Ireland's CMO, Dr Tony Holohan has said that different measures will be taken in the event of a second surge in Coronavirus cases, rather than a full lockdown.
- Dr Holohan has called for a redoubling of efforts in the wearing of face coverings in retail settings, on public transport and where social distancing difficult.
- Dr Holohan has also said that from the beginning of next week the blanket ban on visitation to nursing homes will be lifted, nursing homes have measures in place.
- Agriculture Minister announces €50m support package for beef farmers impacted by the Covid-19 pandemic, which is significantly more than was expected.
- DAA say only ticket holders will be allowed to enter terminal buildings at Dublin and Cork airports and all passengers should wear facemasks in airport buildings.
- Irish Cabinet approves the Education Minister's proposals for 890 schools to run a special summer programme for students who attend disadvantaged schools.

OTHER

- India has reported a record daily increase of Covid cases and became the world's fourth worst-hit country, raising the prospect of a return to lockdown within days.
- EU plans to pump billions of Euros into advance purchase deals with Pharmaceutical companies for potential Coronavirus vaccines using €2.7bn of emergency fund
- The German Cabinet has agreed to temporarily cut VAT to 16% and give parents €300 per child as part of its economic stimulus package following lockdown.
- EU health experts have said that the risk of a second wave of Covid-19 infections big enough to require European lockdowns to be reimposed is moderate to high.
- South Korea have extended prevention and sanitation guidelines as new cases persist and following a series of new clusters around Seoul, with 56 yesterday.
- Surgeons have performed a double lung transplant on a 20 year old hispanic woman, who spent 6 weeks as a Covid-19 patient in a Chicago hospital.
- Twitter has removed more than 170,000 accounts which were tied to an operation to spread pro-China messages, some about the Coronavirus outbreak.
- US and world stocks have fallen sharply as hopes of a quick post-virus economic recovery start to fade and fears of a second wave of the Coronavirus outbreak.











Chart 4: Number of key worker children in attendance 8 April to 5 June 2020





Overall, 779 COVID-19 related deaths had occurred in Northern Ireland by 5 th June, 19 of which occurred in the week ending 5 th June. Thursday 9th April and Wednesday 22nd April saw the greatest number of COVID-19 deaths (25) occurring in a single day. A simple 7 day moving average shows the trend in COVID deaths by smoothing daily fluctuations.

There have been 404 deaths of care home residents involving COVID-19 in the year to date to 5 th June 2020, which is 51.9% of all COVID-19 related deaths. Of the 404 deaths, 82.7% (334) occurred in a care home, with the remaining 70 occurring in hospital
