# **UPDATED ADVICE IN RELATION TO THE NOVEL CORONAVIRUS (Covid-19)**

## **Action Required**

Chief Executives must ensure that this information is drawn to the attention of all clinical staff to enable them to respond accordingly

The HSCB must ensure that this information is cascaded to all General Practitioners and OOH facilities immediately.

- Based on the World Health Organization's declaration that this is a public health emergency of international concern, the UK Chief Medical Officers had raised the risk to the public from low to moderate. This permits the government to plan for all eventualities. The risk to individuals remains low.

## Update on returning travellers

3. Based on the scientific advice of the <u>Scientific Advisory Group for Emergencies</u> (<u>SAGE</u>) the UK Chief Medical Officers are advising anyone who has travelled to the UK from mainland China, Thailand, Japan, Republic of Korea, Hong Kong, Taiwan, Singapore, Malaysia or Macau in the last 14 days and is experiencing cough or fever or shortness of breath, to stay indoors, self-isolate and contact



their GP who will arrange testing or if it is a medical emergency, call 999 and inform the call handler about their recent travel, even if symptoms are mild.

- 4. If any individual has returned from the areas listed below **since February 19th and develop symptoms**, however mild, they should stay indoors, self-isolate and contact their GP who will arrange testing or if it is a medical emergency, call 999 and inform the call handler about their recent travel.
  - Northern Italy (defined by a line above, and not including, Pisa, Florence and Rimini).
  - Iran
  - Vietnam
  - Cambodia
  - Laos
  - Myanmar
- 5. If any individual has returned from the following specific areas since **February 19**, they are being advised to call the dedicated Covid-19 helpline on 0300 200 7885, stay indoors and self-isolate even if they do not have symptoms:
  - Iran
  - Specific lockdown areas in Northern Italy as designated by the Government of Italy
  - Special care zones in South Korea as designated by the Government of the Republic of South Korea
  - Hubei province (returned in the past 14 days)
- 6. As you will appreciate this is a fast moving and changing situation and the list of affected areas will be kept under review.
