2. Richard updated the taskforce on the transmission of the Omicron variant and comparisons/ differentials with South Africa; hospital in-patient numbers and bed capacity.

Draft Omicron response starting point – discussion paper

These included, but were not limited to measures such as household mixing, workplace mitigations, face coverings and testing. Peter outlined engagements with various sectors and stakeholders and current reaction from each. Discussion also focused around the health, financial and political challenges around reaching an agreed

Further work is ongoing separately around the practicalities and affordability of potential support schemes, the outworking of which will be set out in any 'final' proposals for Executive consideration. 5. John Smith advised of plans to seek support from retired teachers to bolster the teaching workforce.
