of the document.



Border Control Issues

- 3. The deputy First Minister advised that, in response to a request from three Ministers to hold an Executive meeting to discuss the Minister of Agriculture, Environment and Rural Affairs' letter of 26 February concerning issues relating to work at the ports, this matter had been included on the agenda for the meeting.
- 4. The Minister of Agriculture, Environment and Rural Affairs outlined his position, which reflected the uncertainty over what the point of entry control posts would need to do.
- 5. The Minister of Finance, the Minister for Infrastructure and the Minister of Justice advised of their concerns regarding the decision taken by the Minister, and of their view that the matter required Executive consideration as a cross-cutting and significant and/or controversial matter.



7. It was agreed that Minister Lyons and the Attorney General would engage further on the matter, and that it would be considered again on the basis of I&S
