Thank you. I agree entirely and, subject to David being content, we will ramp up as quickly as possible from Monday.

We will, of course, ensure that neither the hub nor the docs drift into giving public health advice. However, with hub and docs in operation (both are needed to make this work), we could direct Departments and ALBs to ensure that they raise contingencies issues via that route, rather than bombarding you (but respecting the health lead, and keeping out of your way on health matters). If we have health liaison in the hub, we can ensure that any issues are properly allocated, and informed by health advice.
