<b>KEY POINTS DISCUSSED:</b>		<p>Meeting opened with an update on Covid position. Simon Coveney indicated that numbers were reducing. Robin Swann indicated that starting to see reduction in NI. Care homes have all been visited, 410 had received a second visit and there was a decrease in outbreaks. Concerned about travel and hotel quarantine. Stephen Donnelly indicated that ICU numbers coming down slowly, January had been tough and stay at home message in place until start of March.</p> <p>On data sharing and quarantine Minister Swann indicated that the position on data does not align with ROI update. Simon Coveney highlighted that if NI residents drive across the border they may be asked to return home. Message is only essential travel – stay within 5 km radius.</p> <p>Robin Walker asked for an update on Executive position on hotel quarantine. FM indicated that it was an internal UK issue and under discussion with DfT.</p> <p>Robin Walker said that UK want to share health data. Robin Swann asked for an update on SOS NI Coveney talks. Robin Walker indicated that there was a</p>
