In response to a query from dFM regarding the Shared Prosperity Fund, SoSNI indicated that the details had not yet been decided. There will be additional funding next year. There is a separate levelling up fund for England of approx. £600m which will have Barnett consequentials. FM indicated that greater clarity is required on these funds. In response to a query from SoSNI regarding filling the HOCS role, FM indicated that there would be an announcement shortly. dFM noted that the Joint Board meeting was now postponed and that the Language Bill needed to progress within this mandate. SoSNI accepted the pressure on timelines and indicated a meeting would take place before mid-December. SoSNI noted that the Shared History Fund of £1m was being distributed via the National Lottery and encouraged bids.
