Thank you for your input on this.
From an NHS service delivery perspective we are almost certainly not going to receive from DHSC supply chain sufficient gowns this weekend to equip staff in multiple hospitals and ambulance services to the level of PPE that the recent 6th and 10th April PHE guidance recommends.
We need now to offer an agreed position to all NHS organisations and staff the default PPE that should be adopted to substitute for a gown in the previously agreed PPE ensembles for the 2 scenarios: I) managing an aerosol generating procedure and ii) working in high viral load contact areas such as intensive care. No other PPE element or environment circumstances change other that the unavailability of a gown. Bare below the elbow and hand hygiene etc pertain.
Is it to follow the WHO guidance on this to default to a single use disposable apron as per Standard Infection Control Precautions?
I'm sorry to press but I currently have staff across the NHS caring for 17,000 confirmed COVID 19 positive patients.

I would suggest 1. in OPSS for further update (NR @beis.gov.uk) you speak to NR HSE has not assessed any gowns as unsuitable. We have spoken with Burberry about the gowns they are proposing to produce and are waiting for tests to be completed by them, and are waiting for further information on the stock in Daventry from the Office for Product Safety and Standards following earlier discussions The coveralls piece in a separate chain is relevant here, these are likely to be more appropriate than aprons particularly if AGPs are involved. If you are able to identify what communication was received from HSE and when on those we can look to join the two things together.
