

Exhibit 3: Transfers into GRI ICU – March 2020 - June 2022

Transfers into Glasgow Royal Infirmary Intensive Care Unit

Between March 2020 and June 2022 we transferred 40 patients into ICU at GRI.

13 ICU patients came for burns service input.

<5 HDU patients also came from the Queen Elizabeth University Hospital (QEUH) for plastics input.

<5 ICU patients came to GRI from the Royal Alexandra Hospital (RAH) for gastroenterology input.

<5 ICU patients came from Stobhill Hospital as there is no ICU there.

10 patients came for HPB input from the Beatson West of Scotland Cancer Centre, the Golden Jubilee National Hospital, Lorn & Islands Hospital – 5 HDU and 5 ICU patients.

<5 HDU patients came for upper gastrointestinal surgical input from the Western Isles.

<5 ICU patients came back to GRI from extracorporeal membrane oxygenation (ECMO).

<5 ICU patients came back from QEUH – one had been sent there for ear, nose & throat (ENT) input, one for COVID capacity issues.

<5 ICU patients came for non-specialist ICU care from Oban.

ICU Capacity transfers in totalled 7.

6 had COVID.

<5 came from Inverclyde Royal Hospital in March 2020 as wave 1 hit there, prior to numbers rising at GRI.

<5 came from RAH in February 2021.

<5 came from QEUH in November 2020.

<5 came from Hairmyres Hospital in October 2020.

<5 ICU patients came in October 2020, from RAH, for non-specialist ICU care.
