## Dear Jenny

To be aware. I have requested clearance to change NHS website which is currently out of date for information on clots sort of me against DHSC comms, CMO in between - sub going to SofS. Long story but it was never updated after last MHRA press release because we were waiting for updated advice - dragged on so long it was then too late. JCVI/CHM all wanted proper informed choice. Current content links to out of date MHRA story with **very bad** advice about presenting - implying you have to have four days of headache rather than headache starting more than four days after vaccine.

## Mary

Contact your GP surgery if you have a headache for more than 4 days after your vaccination or get bruising somewhere other than where you had your vaccination.

## Important

There have been reports in some countries of a small number of people having blood clots after the Oxford/AstraZeneca COVID-19 vaccine.

The MHRA says the current evidence does not suggest the clots were caused by the vaccine and you should still get vaccinated when invited.
