	volume, the flip side is that this product is not in use at all in hospitals, instead of fit testing less than
50% of staf	f we will now be asking for near 100% testing., which means that there will be an enormous burden

on health boards to fit test these masks. I'd liken it to asking clinical staff to remove every hand washing dispenser screwed to the wall and replace with a new unit from a different supplier within a period of 2-3 weeks.

Add to this the demand on testing consumables (also on tight supply) then we just may be about to create another massive bottleneck.

This email is not to be critical of anyones efforts but just meant to inform of the wider impacts of decisions made based on a single variable.

The ideal solution is to have these same level negotiations with 3M and Alpha Solway, can we at least attempt this before pushing the button?
