• Growing concern was noted about the B.1.617.2 variant which had originated in India. This variant was now prevalent in North West England and could become the dominant variant within a fortnight. It was likely to be more transmissible (SAGE papers estimated up to 50% more transmissible than B.1.1.7.). While there were also higher case numbers associated with this variant in parts of London and the East Midlands, the North West of England was of particular concern. The JCVI met on 13 May to discuss a potential vaccine and testing response. Consideration was being given to surge vaccination and accelerating second doses, but this had not yet been confirmed.
