In general, my feeling is the tone of the guidance is very much about care homes accepting people being discharged form hospital and it may feel very much like we are saying you must take people. I feel this would be more accepted if the tone was more about - here is some guidance on how to care for people in this period and as part of that you may be admitting new people form hospital. Here is some guidance on how to manage them in a care home setting who are confirmed as having Covid 19.

You will see I have inserted some wording around the requirement for providers to de satisfied they can meet people's needs before they agree to provide a service to them.
