I am including in my response [REDACTED] who has joined my team this week as PH consultant, on secondment from [REDACTED] where she has worked for many years as a H+J PH Specialist. For our pandemic work [REDACTED] is going to work to me on supporting our response to the CYPSE needs to help us increase capacity and support faster responses. So over next few days you will see [REDACTED] increasingly as your point of contact for our work which we hope you will find more supportive given the demands on me for work in prisons and across wider CJS.

On the specific questions asks in the e-mail, I provide some thoughts for you to consider based on current PHE guidance and wider work with the CJS:

- Court attendance
 - What if child wants to go to court and be present? Would we stop them? Advice from PHE is that ideally during the pandemic period, court appearances should be reduced as far as possible to reduce risk of incursion of infection into the CYPSE from those returning from court and also risk of children and young people with COVID-19 attending court while infectious (especially if only very mild symptoms which is not uncommon for this group). As far as we are aware,

PH law cannot prevent someone who is not known/suspected of being COVID-19 infected attending court. But there is wider guidance from HMCTS which will be relevant here and suggest this is raised with them for clarification.

○ If child does not go to court but to local place that offers remote court access if setting doesn't have that, would they still need to be isolated for 14 days afterwards? PHE advise to reduce attendance at courts for reasons cited above. Any space outside of the CYPSE has similar risks so suggest protective isolation on return from any such place if possible.

○ Will SCHs get additional help with court hearing technology (I picked up that YOIs are in scope for some work but STCs and SCH are not **NR** was I think looking into this?) Not for PHE to respond.

● PPE: if sites make their own equipment (eg Vinney has sewing machines and could make reuseable face masks which can be boiled to sterilise) is that permissible? PHE advise that only PPE which is certified and approved for use should be used for healthcare or residential staff or patients to use. It would be unsafe to rely on home-made materials.

● Health services: (you know where this is coming from) anything we can do to stop essential health staff to be redeployed out of SCHs? If we expect them to hang on to sick children they need the health support. I know this has been escalated but good to cover this in some way, if only to manage expectations. The contracted for health service still needs to be provided so the setting should not be left without staff even if this means current staff are replaced with other staff – we need to know asap if this is happening and intervene. Not for PHE to respond.

● Discharges:

○ What about discharging children who have had symptoms? Who is responsible for making sure isolation period is adhered to? PHE advise that planned discharges need to take account of the risk that children may be symptomatic at time of discharge. Therefore, appropriate arrangements can be made if being received into a family home or equivalent for self-isolation and care with additional advice provided to household contacts as per national guidance <https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/covid-19-stay-at-home-guidance/stay-at-home-guidance-for-households-with-possible-coronavirus-covid-19-infection#ending-isolation> If children or young people going into other settings (young adults going to Approved Premises for example), then receiving place needs to be advised. Guidance on APs is undergoing clearance but published soon we hope and an operational guidance note has been previously circulated through HMPPS so they are aware of actions required. Planned discharges should also ensure no child or young person is discharged homeless.

○ Are YOTs set up to receive them? Not for PHE to respond.

● Hospital:

○ If YP needed to be admitted to hospital is bedwatch service still in place: Not for PHE to respond.

○ Protocols with hospitals: if YP admitted, who can visit them? Would SCH staff be treated as family members? Visits to hospitals for anyone are now restricted under social distancing guidance announced a few weeks ago by PM.

● Testing access for staff and for children

○ Keen to have priority access for staff obvs (I raised this in PHE health & Justice call yesterday and was assured youth estate workers incl from STCs and SCHs would be prioritised in the same way as other prison staff, but worth checking. MoJ leading on this) We have also raised this within NHSE&I. PHE support this but policy with DHSC.

○ Children: Lincs had several suspected cases, only one was tested, it was then assumed the others had it and they all went into isolation. If you then have a child who is well all through isolation but then on first day back shows symptoms, you have to put them back into isolation for a further period, essentially could end up with a month in isolation unless you test them. Not in interest of child. Keen to get access to testing for all suspected cases to avoid this. This is subject to advice from regional Health Protection team The management of suspected COVID-19 cases in any outbreak situation will be guided by local PHE Health Protection Teams. The key issue is to prevent transmission of infection balancing needs of vulnerable children and young people.

● Cohorting Guidance: keen on YCS specific guidance Advice on cohorting approaches has been provided by PHE H+J. Publication process for guidance is problematic but we understand the need and will continue to work with NHS and YJS and others to support development,.

● Mobility: has all mobility stopped? (Advised them to check with placements on the specific case they were raising) Not for PHE to respond.

Thanks again for collating all these. A few more I've picked up from SCH managers:

- Court attendance
 - What if child wants to go to court and be present? Would we stop them? **Yes ideally, but legal position on that would need checking?**
 - If child does not go to court but to local place that offers remote court access if setting doesn't have that, would they still need to be isolated for 14 days afterwards? **Yes and this is not advised as if they have COVID and are asymptomatic they would be potentially spreading it**
 - Will SCHs get additional help with court hearing technology (I picked up that YOIs are in scope for some work but STCs and SCH are not – **NR** was I think looking into this?)
- PPE: if sites make their own equipment (eg Vinney has sowing machines and could make reuseable face masks which can be boiled to sterilise) is that permissible? **I would imagine these are not as effective - even the hospital grade ones are not completely effective – again will check**
- Health services: (you know where this is coming from) anything we can do to stop essential health staff to be redeployed out of SCHs? If we expect them to hang on to sick children they need the health support. I know this has been escalated but good to cover this in some way, if only to manage expectations. **The contracted for health service still needs to be provided so the setting should not be left without staff even if this means current staff are replaced with other staff – we need to know asap if this is happening and intervene**
- Discharges:
 - What about discharging children who have had symptoms? Who is responsible for making sure isolation period is adhered to?
 - Are YOTs set up to receive them?
- Hospital:
 - If YP needed to be admitted to hospital is bedwatch service still in place (I said yes on basis of latest convo with PECS but worth including that)
 - Protocols with hospitals: if YP admitted, who can visit them? Would SCH staff be treated as family members? **I don't think anyone with COVID in ICU in hospital can be visited but will check**
- Testing access for staff and for children
 - Keen to have priority access for staff obvs (I raised this in PHE health & Justice call yesterday and was assured youth estate workers incl from STCs and SCHs would be prioritised in the same way as other prison staff, but worth checking. MoJ leading on this) **We have also raised this within NHSE&I**

Hi all

Just to confirm as per my email just now to Jule that all new admissions need to self isolate for 14 days. Added to this, every time a child/yp re-enters the site from outside (after any sort of movement) the 14 days also applies in these cases – they should be treated like a new admission. Movements of any sort need to be reduced as much as possible for this reason as well as to reduce transmission of COVID-19.

We hope to have draft guidance which references this out on Thursday.


